LIMPOPO SE VULLISTERREINE IN
HAGLIKE TOESTAND

Limpopo – AfriForum het vanjaar 135 vullisterreine landwyd geoudit as deel van die organisasie se nasionale projek om die gehalte van vullisterreine in Suid-Afrika te meet.

Slegs een van die nege vullisterreine wat in Limpopo geoudit is, het aan nasionale standaarde voldoen. Kragtens toepaslike wetgewing en regulasies, waaronder die Wet op Nasionale Omgewingsbestuur: Vullis 59 van 2008, moet 'n vullisterrein aan bepaalde vereistes voldoen.

Die oudit bestaan uit 'n lys van 33 vrae wat die minimum vereistes vir vullisterreine in Suid-Afrika meet en sluit faktore soos toegangsbeheer, brande, mediese afval, omheining, rehabilitasie en dies meer in. 'n Vullisterrein moet minstens 80% behaal om aan wetgewing te voldoen.

Volgens AfriForum se distrikskoördineerder vir Limpopo, Magdel Strauss, is die meeste vullisterreine in Limpopo in 'n haglike toestand. “Dit kan hoofsaaklik toegeskryf word aan munisipaliteite wat nie die terreine en die toerusting herstel en instandhou nie.” Strauss sê voorts die algemeenste probleme wat AfriForum tydens die oudit ondervind het, is die afwesigheid van afvalbestuurslisensies en die algehele wanbestuur van die terreine. “Die meeste terreine beskik ook nie oor die nodige personeel of voldoende toegangsbeheer nie.”

AfriForum-takke sal ook druk op owerhede in hul gebiede plaas om afvalmoniteringskomitees te stig om die afvalbestuursproses te verbeter. Dié komitees sal bestaan uit munisipaliteite en belanghebbende partye wat vullisbestuur in die betrokke dorp wil verbeter. AfriForum gaan ook ná afloop van die projek 'n vergadering met die Minister van Omgewingsake Barbara Creecy, belê om terreine te identifiseer sodat dit herstel en weer op peil gebring kan word.

Die ouditverslag sal ook aan die Groen Skerpioene oorhandig word vir verdere ondersoek en optrede teen munisipaliteite wat nie aan die vereistes voldoen nie. AfriForum sal die proses deurlopend monitor om te verseker dat die vullisterreine se standaard genoegsaam verbeter.

SA UNEMPLOYMENT RATE HIT RECORD-HIGH
30.1%... BEFORE COVID-19

South Africa – The results of the quarterly labour force survey (QLFS) for the first quarter of 2020 indicate that employment decreased by 38,000 to 16,4 million and the number of unemployed persons increased by 344,000 to 7,1 million. As a result, the official unemployment rate increased by 1 percentage point to (30,1%) compared to the fourth quarter of 2019.

A net decline in total employment in the first quarter of 2020 was mainly driven by decreases in the number of people employed in the formal sector (50,000) and agriculture (21,000). Increases in employment were observed in the informal sector (3,000) and private households (30,000) during this period.

Most industries experienced job losses in the first quarter of 2020, compared to the fourth quarter of 2019. Finance shed most jobs (50,000), followed by the community and social services (33,000), agriculture (21,000), transport (17,000), manufacturing (15,000), construction (7,000) and utilities (4,000) industries. Year-on year there was a net increase of 91,000 in total employment with community and social services (185,000), agriculture (27,000), and mining (18,000), being the largest contributors to the observed increase.
