





Thabazimbi/ Regorogile - Local authorities are urgently seeking assistance from the community in locating 65-year-old Israel Diboko, a resident of Regorogile Extension 4, who has been missing since Friday 2 February 2024.

Sergeant Maphure Manamela reports that Israel Diboko left his home with the intent of visiting a local pharmacy healthcare centre in town to collect his medication. Concerns grew when he failed to return, prompting his family to report his absence to the police, who have since launched a comprehensive search. Efforts to trace Mr. Diboko led the police and his family to a farm close to his last known location, where he had previously lived. It was discovered there that he had departed the farm without indicating his intended destination, leaving his current whereabouts unknown.

At the time of his disappearance, Mr. Diboko was observed wearing black trousers, a black jacket, a blue golf shirt, and formal black

15-YEAR SENTENCE TO RHINO POACHING SYNDICATE MEMBERS

Thabazimbi – In a significant ruling on Tuesday 6 February 2024, the Thabazimbi Regional Court handed down a 15-year imprisonment sentence to four individuals involved in the illegal hunting of specially protected animals within the Lephalale a rhino poaching incident in the Gravelotte policing policing area.

The accused identified as Amos Movane (45). Senzo Chabalala (35), Mandla Mbosheni (37), and Edias Chippa (45), were implicated in a notorious rhino poaching operation. Their capture was a result of a coordinated effort by law enforcement, following a tip-off that led to their arrest on 30 October 2021 in the Hoopdal policing area.

Colonel Malesela Ledwaba detailed how the suspects were apprehended for conspiring to poach rhinos and for the illegal possession of firearms and ammunition. The arrest was executed by the Stock Theft and Endangered Species Unit (STES), Thabazimbi Reservists, and Hoopdal Police, who

area. The court convicted the men on multiple counts, leading to their comprehensive sentencing:

Further investigations solidified the group's

involvement through DNA evidence linking them to

firearms, ammunition, a silencer, and knives

- Count 1: Conspiracy to hunt and poach rhinos, dehorn them, and trade their horns: 15 years imprisonment.
- Count 2: Hunting of a specially protected animal: 15 years imprisonment.
- Count 3: Prohibited acts concerning wild and alien animals: 15 years imprisonment. Count 4: Prohibited acts relating to firearms: 15
- years imprisonment.
- Count 5: Possession of prohibited firearms: 10 years imprisonment.



Count 10: Possession of dangerous weapons: 5 vears imprisonment.

Count 11: Illegal entry into South Africa without a valid passport: 90 days imprisonment.

The sentences for counts 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 7, 10, and 11 will run concurrently for the first and third accused. Major general Jan Scheepers, acting provincial commissioner of Police in Limpopo, commended the diligent efforts in securing these convictions. underscoring the commitment to preserving South Africa's wildlife and holding those who seek to harm it accountable

The sentencing marks a notable victory in the fight against rhino poaching in the region, sending a strong message to potential poachers about the severe consequences of engaging in such illegal





Thabazimbi launches smart prepaid water meters against a backdrop of community debate

Thabazimbi – The Thabazimbi
Local Municipality (TLM), in
collaboration with Northam
Platinum's Zondereinde
Mine, has embarked on
the rollout of smart prepaid
water meters, a move
receiving mixed feedback from the
community.

"This initiative, supported by the National Government as part of a broader Debt Relief

Programme, aims to introduce a cost recovery system for water usage," a TLM statement reads on 7 February 2024.

The decision to install prepaid meters is framed as a strategy to enhance municipal revenue collection and manage the debt owed to Magalies Water, while also allowing residents to monitor and control their water consumption.

However, this initiative has not been met without scepticism. Community members have voiced their concerns on social media, questioning the timing and effectiveness of installing smart meters in a region grappling with frequent water shortages. Some residents go weeks on end with water shortages. Queries also extend to the implications for households relying on borehole water.

So far, the installation of prepaid water meters has been successfully completed in several areas, including Northam Extensions 2 and 6, Mojuteng, Lefika, Northam Town, Wildebeeslaagte, and Thabazimbi Group 5.

The rollout will continue across more regions within Thabazimbi, including Extensions 7, 17, 18, 31, 32, 35, 37, and 47, as well as Mircomatica, Hibiscus, Platinum Houses, and Bosveld Park.

As this initiative unfolds, the dialogue between the municipality and its residents remains crucial in addressing concerns and ensuring the community's needs and reservations are considered.
