Background: Rhino Andalusite Mine ("RAM"), a division of Imerys Refractory Minerals South Africa (Pty) Ltd ("Imerys"), mines and processes Andalusite. RAM is situated approximately 14 km southwest of Thabazimbi, in the Thabazimbi Local Municipality, within the Waterberg District Municipality in the Limpopo province. Mineral processing at RAM occurs in four main processes: crushing and screening, dense medium separation, drying and magnetic separation. The Andalusite is dried in two coal-fired rotary dryers.

Legislative Requirements: In terms of Section 22 of the National Environmental Management: Air Quality Act 39 of 2004 (NEM: AQA), no person may conduct an activity listed on a national list anywhere in the Republic of South Africa or listed on a list applicable to a province anywhere in that province without a provisional Atmospheric Emission License (PAEL) or an Atmospheric Emission License (AEL). The Licensing Authority, the Limpopo Department of Economic Development, Environment and Tourism (LEDET) approved a Section 22A rectification application by Imerys on 24 January 2024. LEDET provided that Imerys (RAM) must apply for the renewal of its AEL (12/4/12-W1/R1) with the Waterberg District Municipality as the Licensing Authority, within 7 months from the date of the approval letter (24 January 2024).

Application: RAM submitted its AEL renewal application, via email, to the Waterberg District Municipality as the Licensing Authority on 30 August 2024.

23-YEAR-OLD SENTENCED TO 25 YEARS FOR RAPING TWO MINOR GIRLS IN THABAZIMBI



Lebogang Letlhake was sentenced to 25 years imprisonment for the rape of two minor girls.

Thabazimbi - The Thabazimbi Regional Court has sentenced 23-year-old Lebogang Letlhake to 25 years imprisonment for the rape of two minor girls, a crime committed in January 2022. The sentencing took place on Monday, 30 September 2024, following a detailed investigation by the Thabazimbi Family Violence, Child Protection, and Sexual Offenses (FCS) unit.

According to brigadier Hlulani Mashaba, on 1 January 2022, at approximately 03:00, two girls, aged 14 and 16, were walking home from a New Year's celebration in Regorogile. They encountered Letlhake, who threatened them with a firearm and forced them to his residence. He raped the 16-year-old and locked her in a toilet before dragging the 14-year-old to another house, where he also raped her.


The girls managed to escape and reported the incident to the police, leading to an investigation. The case was assigned to warrant officer Daniel Lotter of the Thabazimbi FCS Unit. Following his swift and thorough investigation, Letlhake was arrested and charged with two counts of rape, two counts of kidnapping, and two counts of pointing a firearm.

During sentencing, Letlhake received 25 years for each count of rape, along with additional sentences for the kidnapping and firearm charges, which will run



FORMER THABAZIMBI MUNICIPAL MANAGER FACES CHARGES IN COURT

Thabazimbi - Morutse Edward Ntsoane (50), a without adhering to the required tender processes former municipal manager of the Thabazimbi Local Municipality, appeared before the Thabazimbi Magistrates Court on 23 September 2024. He is facing charges related to the contravention of the Municipal Finance Management Act (MFMA). Ntsoane's arrest was carried out by the Hawks' Serious Commercial Crimes Investigation unit, based in Polokwane, at OR Tambo International Airport on 20 September 2024. The charges stem from alleged financial mismanagement dating back to

2013 when Ntsoane served as municipal manager and accounting officer for the Thabazimbi Local Municipality.

According to warrant officer Lethunya Mmuroa from the Hawks, Ntsoane is accused of facilitating a contract between the municipality and a service provider for goods and services procurement further proceedings.

outlined in the MFMA. It is further alleged that he neglected his duty as an accounting officer by failing to take reasonable steps to prevent irregular

expenditure, resulting in a financial loss of over R3.8 million to the municipality.

The investigation also uncovered a similar incident from 2012. A service provider, who had previously worked with the Waterberg District Municipality, was offered a contract for placement and benchmarking services at Thabazimbi Local Municipality. Unlike the Waterberg

contract, the Thabazimbi tender was never publicly advertised, and the service provider involved allegedly did not submit any formal tender documents.

The investigation continues as the court awaits




