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Rooiberg/ Koedoeskop - A devastating act of violence has shaken the Limpopo police force. Lieutenant general Thembi Hadebe, provincial commissioner of police in Limpopo, has expressed her shock and condemnation following the tragic killing of a 47-year-old police sergeant stationed at Rooiberg Police Station in the Waterberg District.

The sergeant, a dedicated officer and grandmother, was discovered lifeless in her home on the morning of Sunday, 26 January 2025, by her 6-year-old grandson. Her vehicle and boyfriend were missing, sparking an immediate investigation. Later that day, her vehicle was found abandoned 50 kilometres away on the Thabazimbi Road near Koedoeskop. Colonel Malesela Ledwaba confirmed that the sergeant had returned home with her boyfriend the previous evening. While the motive for the crime remains unclear, domestic violence is a suspected factor

Lieutenant General Hadebe has called for the full mobilisation of police resources to apprehend the suspect and bring justice to the grieving family. She extended her deepest condolences to the family, friends, and colleagues of the late sergeant.

4 YOUNG **LIVES** LOST **DAILY**



SA – Every year, far too many young lives are lost on South Africa's roads. According to data from the Road Accident Fund (RAF), an average of 1,288 school-going children aged 5 to 19 lose their lives annually in road accidents. This alarming figure translates to approximately four fatalities every single day and over 100 deaths each month a heartbreaking reality that demands immediate action from all road users

From 2019 to 2023, 60% of these tragic fatalities involved children struck by vehicles as pedestrians. Another 36% were passengers, while 2% were cyclists, and 2% drivers. These numbers highlight the urgent need for road users to reflect on their behaviour and take responsibility

for ensuring the safety of children on the roads "South African road users must stay alert. Your actions can profoundly impact human lives, particularly those of our future leaders," says RAF chief executive officer, Collins Letsoalo. "Let us be a nation moved by the loss of human lives and injuries caused by motor vehicle accidents. After all, 88% of all road crashes are due to human factors."

Motor vehicle accidents are often caused by preventable behaviours such as texting while driving, eating behind the wheel, or overtaking recklessly. Parents and guardians are urged to teach children proper road safety practices and to remain vigilant for reckless drivers.

Recovery

Thabazimbi – The recent floods wreaked havoc across Thabazimbi, leaving roads battered and residents frustrated. While the community rallied together to assist those in need, the damage to infrastructure — particularly the roads — remains a pressing issue.

The Thabazimbi Local Municipality (TLM) has already begun repair efforts, but much work lies ahead. On Tuesday, 21 January 2025, TLM launched an urgent pothole patching operation following two weeks of relentless rain and flooding. The initiative is being bolstered by JC Havenga of Coastal Hire, who provided essential machinery, along with the dedicated efforts of Public Works Thabazimbi.

TLM expressed its sincere gratitude to JC Havenga for his generous contribution, which is helping to restore the roads and improve safety for motorists. However, drivers are urged to remain cautious, as repairs and maintenance will continue over the coming days. Work crews and detours may cause temporary disruptions, but these efforts are essential to ensuring safer travel for all.

In the meantime, residents have taken it upon themselves to warn fellow motorists of dangerous potholes. Some have resorted to creative makeshift warnings — like the one in 8ste Laan, where a tree adorned with red ribbon serves as a stark caution: "If your car passes through here, it might be the last place it goes through!"

Elsewhere, in Berg Street, a single traffic cone stands as a lone sentry over a deep pothole, urging drivers to steer clear.

Despite the challenges, progress is being made. While the road to recovery may be bumpy, the combined efforts of the municipality, businesses, and residents show that Thabazimbi's spirit remains unshaken. Drive safely, stay vigilant, and let's navigate this road to recovery together.

Thabazimbi - A long-standing nightmare for a family in Judith Street, Thabazimbi, has finally come to an end after more than a month of living with a sewage disaster in their yard. The incident began in mid-December 2024, when a manhole behind the family's home started overflowing with foul-smelling sewage.

The house, which had been built over the manhole, saw the sewage spilling into the yard, creating a serious health hazard for the elderly couple and their son, who owns the property.

The family, enduring this situation since 14 December 2024, reached out to the Thabazimbi Local Municipality (TLM) multiple times. Despite repeated promises that they would send a team to investigate, the situation only worsened. As the days passed, the sewage continued to flow, creating an unbearable stench and unsanitary conditions.

The son fell ill due to the unhygienic conditions. "My son even had to go to the doctor because of this," said his mother. In response, the doctor advised: "Move if you can't fix it!"

Finally, after a month of distress, Thabazimbi Local Municipality arrived at the property last week and managed to fix the manhole, putting an end to the sewage spill. "Thank you, TLM!" the family exclaimed, relieved to finally have their vard back in a liveable state.







GUIDELINES FOR USING A FIREARM IN **SELF-DEFENCE**

Understanding the law in **South Africa**

In South Africa, owning a firearm is a significant responsibility, particularly with • the current climate of crime and security concerns. Many people carry firearms for protection, but it is crucial to understand when you are legally justified in using them. The law that governs firearm use in selfdefence is the Firearms Control Act 60 of 2000, which outlines the rights and limitations of firearm owners. It is critical to understand that pointing a firearm - real or fake - at someone can be considered a criminal offence if done without appropriate cause, such as in self-defence against a credible threat.

WHEN AND WHEN NOT TO USE YOUR

- In South Africa, you are allowed to use a firearm for self-defence in cases where . your life, or the life of someone else, is under immediate threat.
- The Firearms Control Act and principles of Section 49 of the Criminal Procedure Act further specify the concept of "proportionality" in using force, stating that the force used must be reasonable and in direct response to the threat at hand.

SCENARIOS ILLUSTRATING USING A FIREARM IS JUSTIFIED AND WHEN IT IS NOT

- If an armed intruder enters your home and poses a direct threat to you or your family, using a firearm in self-defence could be lawful. The immediate risk of death or severe injury justifies the action under selfdefence principles.
- During an attempted hijacking where the attacker is visibly armed and showing intent to harm you or forcefully take your vehicle, firearm use is generally considered within • legal boundaries, especially if you are • Contact the SAPS immediately or as soon

cornered or unable to escape safely.

- If someone makes threatening gestures but is unarmed and at a distance, using a firearm would likely be considered • excessive. The law requires that the perceived threat be imminent and likely to • cause severe harm.
- If you are involved in an argument where no physical threat exists, drawing or firing a firearm is illegal. Arguments or disagreements, no matter how heated, do • not justify using deadly force.
- If you witness an individual being attacked and can confirm the attacker is armed or is likely to cause serious harm, you may intervene with a firearm. However, this is risky and should only be done if you are certain of the threat level and unable to . seek help in time.
- Using a fake firearm for self-defence may be interpreted as intimidation or even as a • form of crimen injuria (a legal term used in referring to the unlawful and intentional impairment of someones dignity). This is because it involves the intent to deceive or threaten another person, which could have legal repercussions depending on the circumstances. If an assailant realises the weapon is fake, it could escalate the situation and potentially lead to charges against the person using the fake firearm.

SELF-DEFENSE USE

If you find yourself in a situation where you have used your firearm in self-defence, it is vital to follow these steps to protect your rights and comply with the law:

- Stay calm and secure the scene if possible.
- Secure your firearm safely and ensure the immediate area is safe.
- Do not tamper with evidence.

- as you feel safe to do so.
- Co-operate fully with the officers on the

reality.

- Give your statement, factually, detailing the events as they occurred.
- Seek legal assistance by contacting a qualified professional experienced in firearm laws and self-defence cases. Having legal representation will help you navigate investigations that may follow.
- Be prepared for a full investigation by the SAPS, who will conduct an extensive investigation to determine if your actions were legally justified.
- They may collect evidence, take witness statements, and review your firearm license.
- Comply with further legal procedures, for example, when the SAPS requires your firearm for ballistic analysis.
- Co-operate and provide the documentation requested.
- some jurisdictions, including South Africa, Expect a thorough process as SAPS and the courts evaluate your actions within the legal framework of self-defence.

UNDERSTANDING YOUR RIGHTS AND **RESPONSIBILITIES**

- Firearm owners must take every step to understand their rights and responsibilities under the Firearms Control Act.
- Exercising caution, remaining aware of your surroundings, and recognising when and how to use force is essential.



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
